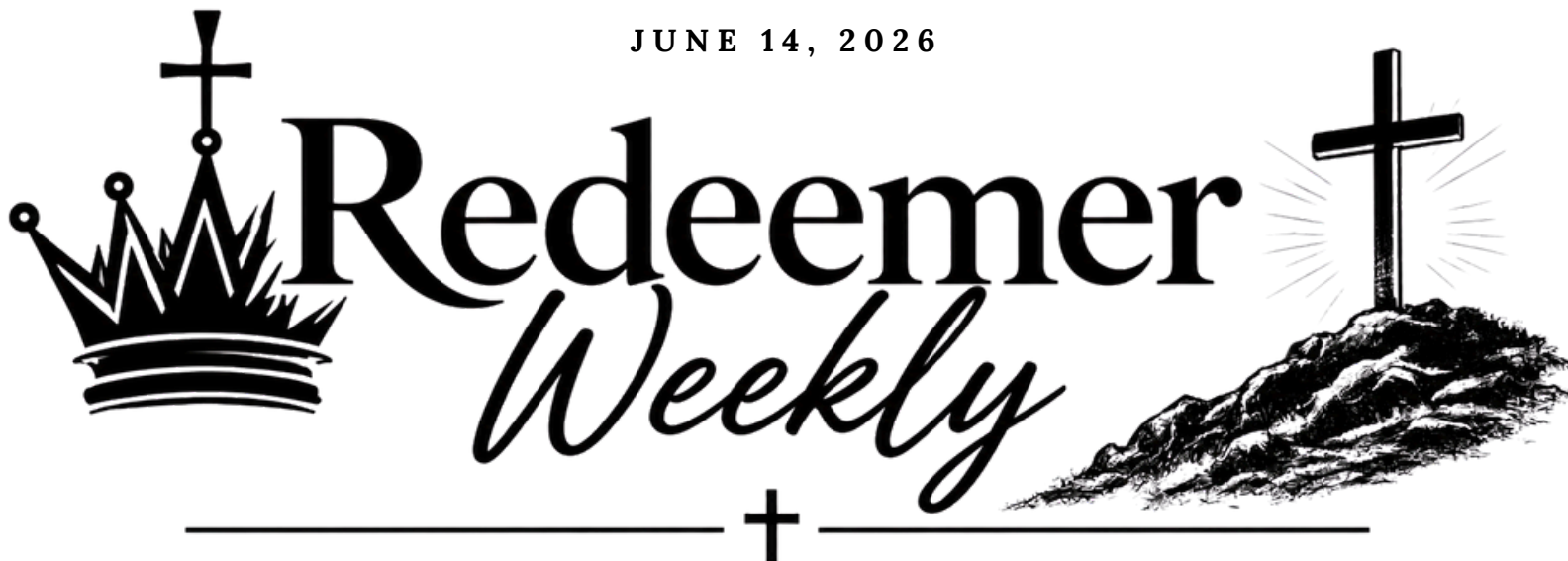

A PSALM OF JOYFUL WORSHIP

PSALM 100

Why do God's people worship? What is the foundation of true praise? Psalm 100 answers these questions with one of the most beloved songs in all of Scripture. In just five short verses, the psalmist calls us to joyful worship, grateful service, and heartfelt thanksgiving before the Lord.

This Psalm reminds us that worship is far more than a religious activity. It is the glad response of redeemed sinners to the God who created us, shepherds us, and saves us. The Lord calls His people to come before Him with singing, to enter His courts with praise, and to bless His holy name. He alone is worthy of our worship because He is God, because we belong to Him, and because His goodness, mercy, and truth endure forever.

Most importantly, Psalm 100 points us to the Lord Jesus Christ, the Good Shepherd who laid down His life for His sheep and opened the way into God's presence through His blood. Through Christ we become the people of His pasture and recipients of His everlasting mercy.

Today we consider this wonderful Psalm and discover the call, the foundation, and the reason for joyful worship. May our hearts be stirred to praise the God who is good, whose mercy is everlasting, and whose truth endures to all generations.

CHRIST RECEIVES SINNERS

“Then drew near unto him all the publicans and sinners for to hear him. And the Pharisees and scribes murmured, saying, This man receiveth sinners, and eateth with them” - Luke 15: 1-2

While the self-righteous Pharisees and Scribes withdrew from the Lord Jesus Christ and then harshly criticized Him, many publicans and sinners drew near to hear Him.

“No man can come to me, except the Father which hath sent me draw him: and I will raise him up at the last day.” (John 6: 44)

What a blessing from the Lord to have a willingness to draw near to Him and then to have ears to actually hear a word from Him.

“Immediately therefore I sent to thee; and thou hast well done that thou art come. Now therefore are we all here present before God, to hear all things that are commanded thee of God.” (Acts 10: 33)

His words are words of life.

“Verily, verily, I say unto you, He that heareth my word, and believeth on him that sent me, hath everlasting life, and shall not come into condemnation; but is passed from death unto life.” (John 5: 24)

His words are words of salvation.

“For I am not ashamed of the gospel of Christ: for it is the power of God unto salvation to every one that believeth; to the Jew first, and also to the Greek.” (Romans 1: 16)

“For the word of God is quick, and powerful, and sharper than any twoedged sword, piercing even to the dividing asunder of soul and spirit, and of the joints and marrow, and is a discernor of the thoughts and intents of the heart.” (Hebrews 4: 12)
The worst thing the Pharisees and scribes said of the Lord, “This man receiveth sinners, and eateth with them;” is the best thing any sinner could hear.

“For Christ is the end of the law for righteousness to every one that believeth.” (Romans 10: 4)

It is not sin that keeps a man from hearing the good news of the gospel of Christ, it is his presumed righteousness he is going about to establish by his religious deeds.

“For as the Father raiseth up the dead, and quickeneth them; even so the Son quickeneth whom he will.” (John 5: 21)

No man will ever come to Christ while he is resting in the deeds of the law for salvation.

“Now we know that what things soever the law saith, it saith to them who are under the law: that every mouth may be stopped, and all the world may become guilty before God. Therefore by the deeds of the law there shall no flesh be justified in his sight: for by the law is the knowledge of sin.” (Romans 3: 19-20)

“And you hath he quickened, who were dead in trespasses and sins;” (Ephesians 2: 1)

It is only by the almighty power of His sovereign grace that will effectually quicken us and make us alive in Christ that will cause us to draw near to Him, to hear Him and to believe Him.

“Whosoever believeth that Jesus is the Christ is born of God: and every one that loveth him that begat loveth him also that is begotten of him.” (1 John 5: 1)

This Man receives sinners!

What a miracle of amazing grace.

PSALM 100

*"Serve the LORD with gladness: come before his presence with singing."
Psalm 100:2*

Have you ever been so happy that you wanted to sing? Maybe you sang your favorite song in the car, at home, or while playing outside. Psalm 100 tells us that God's people should come before Him with singing and gladness.

But why should we be so joyful?

The Bible gives us the answer. God made us. He takes care of us. He gives us food, family, friends, and every good thing we enjoy. Most of all, God sent His Son, Jesus Christ, to save His people from their sins.

Psalm 100 says that we are "the sheep of his pasture." Sheep need a shepherd to guide and protect them. Jesus is the Good Shepherd. He loves His sheep and gave His life for them on the cross. He rose again and now watches over His people forever.

When we think about how good God is, our hearts should be filled with thankfulness. We can worship Him by singing, praying, reading His Word, and obeying Him. Worship is not just something we do at church on Sunday. It is something we can do every day because God is always worthy of praise.

The next time you sing a hymn at church, remember that you are singing to the God who made you, loves you, and cares for you. Sing with joy because the Lord is good!
